Let Us Never Forget The Reformation

ast month Jane and I enjoyed the wonderful experience of walking in the steps of the Reformers throughout Germany, France and Switzerland. What an awesome blessing it was to see the historical sites where godly men were used by our Sovereign Lord to re-establish His Word as the supreme authority for faith and life. As we traveled from site to site and heard how the Reformers boldly and courageously reclaimed and proclaimed the Gospel, I realized there is a critical need for godly men and women to do the same thing today.

The Gospel must be reclaimed again because compromisers have exchanged it for a perverted man-centered gospel that does not call sinners to repentance. Those who are promoting ecumenical unity and church growth prefer this gospel because it is more inclusive and tolerant of doctrinal error and sin. We must continue to reclaim the biblical Gospel and remain sanctified by the truth!

Join me as I share the highlights of my trip back into Church history. You can marvel at the way God worked through the Reformers to restore His Church with His Word. As we look back, let us ask some questions of ourselves. How is God working through me? Am I faithfully doing His will or being complacent out of fear or apathy? What impact am I having on the circle of influence God has placed me in? Am I speaking the truth in love or remaining silent as Satan's lies continue to hold precious souls captive?

In Worms we witnessed a dramatic irony as we were viewing a monument erected in memory of the Reformers. A Catholic procession, made up of about 300 people with several bishops and priests, 30 altar boys, and the Eucharist mounted in a monstrance and carried under a canopy of fine linen, paraded right in front of us. My heart was burdened with compassion for those Catholics who are still blinded from the truth that the Reformers gave their lives to proclaim.

I was inspired by Luther's single-mindedness and unwavering fidelity to the truth of Scripture and how he remained steadfast against all opposition, even under threats of death. He was the flash point which caused the long-smoldering moral and doctrinal corruption within the church to suddenly break into flames. Initially, he saw himself as a great reformer of the Catholic Church, but in the end, Christianity was divided into two separate churches.

After surviving a severe thunderstorm, Luther kept his promise to become a monk and take the high road to heaven. The life of a monk during Luther's time was hard, and consisted of fasting, prayer and silence. Luther went beyond the strict demands of the monastery because he was so burdened with his sin. He would fast three days instead of one and sleep without a blanket in order to suffer for his sins. He also took the sacrament of penance to an extreme, often spending hours in the confessional box several times each day. In 1507, Luther was ordained as a priest in Erfurt and started studying Theology at the University of Erfurt. As Luther celebrated his first Mass and spoke the words: "I sacrifice to You the living God" he became so terror stricken that he felt like running from the church. This gives us a deep insight into Luther's great fear of God.

He could not bear the thought of standing before God without a mediator.

In 1510 Luther traveled to Rome and was appalled at the horrid religious corruption that he saw, including the buying and selling of church offices and the sexual immorality of popes and bishops with their mistresses, prostitutes and illegitimate children. During his 4 week stay, Luther climbed the sacred stairs in Rome to gain an indulgence for his grandfather. On each step he recited the Our Father, but when he arrived at the top he asked: "Who knows if this is true?" How can this appease a holy God?

After returning to Germany, Luther lectured through the Psalms, Romans, Galatians and Hebrews and came to realize a sinner could only be forgiven by divine grace through faith in the crucified and resurrected Savior. This was in direct conflict with the common practice of the 16th century church by which forgiveness could be obtained through the sale of indulgences. Luther became outraged by the scare tactics and high-pressure sales pitches for indulgences by a Dominican Monk named John Tetzel. He would manipulate people's emotions with words such as these: "Listen to the voices of your dear dead relatives and friends, beseeching you. 'Pity us, pity us. We are in dire torment from which you can redeem us for a pittance. Will you let us lie here in flames?' Remember as soon as the coin in the coffer rings, the soul from purgatory springs."

Luther regularly listened to the confessions of people who had purchased indulgences but never expressed any sign of repentance or sorrow for their sins. This made him furious and inspired him to write his 95 Theses at Wittenberg to show that God's pardon could not be bought with money. Within a year of posting his theses on the door of the Castle Church, October 31, 1517, the Papal Court in Rome began an inquisition on the alleged "heretic."

In 1521, the Holy Roman Emperor, Charles V, demanded that Luther appear before the diet of the Holy Roman Empire at Worms. He appeared before the Emperor twice; each time he was told to recant his teachings. Luther didn't see that there was any Scriptural reason to recant. He said, "Unless I am convinced by Scripture and plain reason I do not accept the authority of the popes and Page 2 councils, for they have contradicted each other, my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not recant anything for to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. God help me. Amen."

He was immediately outlawed by the Holy Roman Empire and banned from the Catholic Church. Realizing the threat of death, Fredrick the Wise staged an abduction of Luther and he was taken to the Wartburg Castle in Eisenach. Luther hid in the castle for ten months and translated the New Testament into German. He felt that the Scriptures should be available for all to read, understand and believe as the supreme authority for faith.

Pope Leo declared 41 articles of Luther's teachings heretical, and his books were publicly burned in Rome. Luther, in turn, burned the Papal Bull announcing his excommunication from the Church.

In Augsburg we visited St. Ann's Church where <u>The Augsburg Confession</u> was written by <u>Phillip Melanchthon</u> with Luther's approval in 1530. However, five years ago, this church became the place for another historic event when the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) grossly and deliberately betrayed Luther by signing a Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification with Roman Catholics. By signing this accord the LWF embraced the Council of Trent, and in so doing, formally denied the very doctrine upon which the true church stands or falls. Justification is by grace alone through faith alone because of Christ alone.

We also visited Eisleben, the town where Luther died just a few hundred yards from his place of birth. In his 62 years God worked through him in a mighty way to impact the world and the future of the church.

Following are two of Luther's most memorable quotes:

"If I profess with the loudest voice and clearest exposition every portion of the truth of God, except that little point which the world and the devil are at that moment attacking, I am not professing Christ, however boldly I may be confessing Him. Where the battle rages, there the loyalty of the soldier is proved."

"We cannot attain to the understanding of Scripture either by study or by the intellect. (See Reformers on page 8)

Christian Coalition President Converts to Roman Catholicsim

John Giles, president of the Christian Coalition of Alabama, remembers well the time he got lost in a Roman Catholic Church. "I couldn't even follow the order of service, it was so foreign to me," Giles says of that day some six years ago. Since then, he's found his way and a new home in the Roman Catholic Church – a home that might seem foreign to the overwhelmingly Protestant church population of Alabama. In any case, Giles and his wife, Deborah, were received into the Catholic Church at St. Peter's Parish in Montgomery on Easter Sunday. Such a decision normally wouldn't be a matter of public interest, but Giles says he anticipated the questions that have followed his conversion from the Protestant faith. He found himself in awe of its history and ritual, particularly its use of site, sound, smell, taste and touch in each service. Giles said, "There is a perception among Protestants that if you're Episcopal or Catholic, you're not even saved, you're not born again, which is totally a myth." Giles hopes to build bridges where there weren't bridges because Christians are Christians. "There's no such thing as Christians and Catholics," he said. (Associated Press, 5/26/04)

PTG Under Attack

Proclaiming the Gospel Ministries and Cheryl Schupbach of SX Web Solutions, who hosts our web-site, have come under massive attacks in the last few months. Those who are trying to shut down PTG have been hitting us with a constant barrage of viruses and also succeeded in having a seminar in NY cancelled. Enormous amounts of e-mail have been sent in attempt to "jam" and crash the server. This was followed by a new attack strategy against other ministries on the server. The attackers began forging emails to make spam appear as if it was orginating from PTG. AOL alone has been receiving about 500,000 emails every hour for 2 months that have been forged with the names of Proclaiming the Gospel and other ministries on the server. The result is that AOL, Earthlink, Verizon, Comcast, and other providers have had to block legitimate business and personal email to stop these forged emails.

These attacks, many of which have been traced back to their points of origin from Italy and Catholic Parishes, have caused Cheryl Schupbach a great deal of stress. The situation is not only affecting her business and the ministries she hosts, but her health as well. All she wants to do is to serve God by publishing His truth! Please pray for Cheryl and PTG. 

If you define a Catholic as one who adheres to the teachings and traditions of the Roman Catholic Church, then it is impossible for a Catholic to also embrace the Gospel of Jesus Christ. No one can believe two diametrically opposed gospels simultaneously. Catholics must repent of Rome's gospel of works and sacraments and believe the Gospel of grace to be a Christian (1 Cor. 15:1-4). Having said that, there may be born-again Christians in the Catholic Church who have yet to come out of their apostate church to worship God in Spirit and truth (John 4:24). As these new converts are discipled in the truth of God's word and are taught to observe ALL that Christ commanded, they will leave and not participate in the serious sin of idolatry any longer (Mat. 28:19-20). What in the World is Going On?

Catholics & Islam Together

Roman Catholic Cardinal George Pell and a prominent Muslim cleric led hundreds of Christians, Muslims, Jews, Buddhists and Hindus in a prayer for global peace and tolerance. Worshippers packed St Mary's Cathedral in Sydney for the inter-faith prayer meeting featuring New York Imam Feisal Rauf. Rauf told the gathering that in today's world people from all religious faiths, and even those with no religion, must talk and seek to understand their different points of view. He prayed, "O Almighty Creator, we call upon you to inspire all of us present to seek a deeper global commitment to world peace because in that commitment lies one of the purest paths to self-perfection and compassion and intimacy with you." Eucharistic Dimension of Mary in "The Passion"

The relationship between The Passion of the Christ and the Eucharist contains a reference to the Eucharistic dimension of Marv. says Vatican theologian, Father Castellano Cervera, who is a specialist in Marian studies. As of Monday, the movie had taken in \$579 million in receipts worldwide. Q: A priest acknowledged that Gibson's film has enabled him to understand more profoundly the sacrament of the Eucharist, in regard to the meaning of the sacrifice and of the blood poured out to wash away the sins of men. What is your opinion? Cervera: "The priest who acts in the person of Christ cannot live the celebration without seeking to identify himself with Christ's feelings, as the words of the Missal indicate. A correct way to celebrate Mass...is to offer the sacrifice of Christ and to offer oneself and the Church, together with the holy and immaculate Victim, in communion with Christ who offered himself and continues to offer himself for us." Q: No other film has ever represented in such a precise

way the figure of Mary who says to Jesus: "Body of my body, blood of my blood." What would you say in this respect? Cervera: "Mary indicates that that flesh that suffers and that blood that is poured out in the flagellation, and all through Calvary and on the cross, is flesh of her flesh and blood of her blood. Deep down it affirms that...she feels in her flesh and in her blood all that her Son suffers, as if each pain was lived and suffered by her, with exquisite maternal sensitivity. She had heard it from Simeon as a prophecy. But now she was living it with a realism that is unimaginable." (Zenit, 5/5/04)

"Left Behind" Series Labeled Anti-Catholic

The "Left Behind" series of Christian apocalyptic novels denies a number of Catholic teachings and "is both subtly and overtly anti-Catholic," says an article in the U.S. Bishops' quarterly publication. Catholics could easily be drawn into fundamentalist teachings if they have not received solid formation in Catholic teaching. The Pontifical Biblical Commission says that any literal reading of portions of the Bible written in nonliteral, literary forms distorts the meaning. A seven-year tribulation between the 'rapture' and the return of Christ is not biblical. The postrapture, prejudgment scenario in the 'Left Behind' books borders on Pelagianism because characters seem to be working to redeem themselves. Pelagianism holds that grace depends on human initiative, not on God's initiative. The books present a "harsh and judgmental" image of God, offer a theology of suffering that is not Catholic - the rapture saves the good from the trials of the end time - and deny the efficaciousness of baptism. The series portrays a self-centered, obese American cardinal becoming pope in an election rigged by the Antichrist and then leading the Antichrist's new one-world religion. (CNS, 4/12/04)

Holy Roman Empire

The leader of the world's one billion Roman Catholics, Pope John Paul, welcomed the 10 new nations of the European Union but said the bloc could only face the challenges of the 21st century if it defended its Christian roots. The pope, whose native country, Poland, is one of the new countries in the 25strong EU, told a packed St Peter's Square Europe's identity would be "incomprehensible" without Christianity. "Only a Europe that does not remove, but rediscovers its Christian roots will reach the stature needed for the great challenges of the third millennium: peace, dialogue between cultures and religions, the safeguarding of creation," he said. He has repeatedly called for the bloc to enshrine Christianity in its constitution, but this has been resisted by secular politicians. (Reuters, 5/2/04)

Mary's Extreme Makeover

The Holy Mother is getting a makeover. She is a modern, multitasking mama fighting for social justice. She is a healer. She doesn't disappear after her son is crucified. She moves his ministry forward, teaching until she is in her 50s. There is much more to Mary than the 13 brief references to her in the Gospels, according to several experts' research. New books about Mary are capturing the public's interest and kindling debate over her place in Catholic life. They come at a time when some Catholic scholars are questioning a Vatican II decision that, "radically minimized" Mary's spirituality. Some parishes have overreacted to the swinging pendulum by draping or taking down old-fashioned statues of Mary. Chapel renovations at Holy Trinity Seminary in Irving will include removal of a large image of Mary suspended on a cross that features Jesus and God the Father on either side, holding a crown over her head. Holy Trinity officials said the image isn't being removed for theological reasons. Through all the changes, Mary's mystery and spiritual meaning still have vitality for millions of believers. There are more reported sightings of her than of any other holy figure. The Catholic Church only recognizes as authentic the sightings at Guadalupe, Mexico; Lourdes, France; and Fatima, Portugal. But Web sites abound with claims, information, speculation, and trivia about her. The depiction of Mary in The Passion of The Christ is certain to become one of her most touching and enduring popular culture images, several scholars said. (Dallas Morning News, 5/8/04)

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

Doctrinal Differences of the Reformation

Protestant

• Justification by faith alone. Christ's sacrifice atones for all the believer's sins and provides a permanent right standing before God. Human effort has no effect.

• All believers are priests and have equal access to God through the mediation of Jesus who is the only mediator.

• The scriptures as the only divine source of true doctrine.

• Christ's sacrifice happened once and cannot be repeated.

• Mary, the saints and angels should not be the objects of prayer or veneration. The making of images encourages idolatrous worship that should be directed to God.

• God chose and predestined believers to adoption as sons according to the good pleasure of His will.

• The Bible speaks of two sacraments: baptism and the Lord's Supper and no priestly status is required to perform them.

Roman Catholic

• Justification is by faith and good works. Acts of devotion, charity, the sacraments, good works, etc. are necessary for salvation.

• The Catholic priesthood is necessary to perform the sacraments necessary for spirtual health and salvation.

• Scripture and tradition, as interpreted by bishops, provide the rule of faith.

• The Eucharist is a mystery in which the sacrifice of Christ is reenacted.

• The intercession of Mary, the saints and angels is valuable and necessary in helping Christians achieve salvation. Christians should venerate Mary.

• God's omnipotence does not restrict human will and each person is responsible for earning their own salvation.

• There are seven sacraments: baptism, Eucharist, penance, confirmation, marriage, holy orders, extreme unction.

Your first duty is to begin by prayer. Entreat the Lord to grant you, of His great mercy, the true understanding of His Word. There is no other interpreter of the Word of God than the Author of this Word, as He Himself has said, 'They shall all be taught of God.' Hope for nothing from your own labors, from your own understanding: trust solely in God, and in the influence of His Spirit."
